Art Foundations, grade 7 and 8

Course Description: SEMESTER COURSE (18 weeks)

Students will try out a variety of artmaking techniques and materials.

Students will focus on the theme of transformation of ideas, media, and self.

Students will make projects involving drawing, painting, printmaking, design, ceramics, sculpture, and crafts.

Art Extensions



Course Description: SEMESTER/YEAR (10 to 36 weeks)

Prerequisite: Art Foundations

Students with an above average interest in art are encouraged to explore artmaking media based on their own personal ideas and interests

Students will explore printmaking, sculpture, and design, with a focus on documenting and reflecting on their own work to produce a portfolio.

3-D Art Exploration

Course Description: SEMESTER COURSE (18 weeks)

Prerequisite: Art Foundations

Students will explore the third dimension using traditional and experimental media to make 3-D art.

Focuses on strategic thinking, problem solving, and collaboration.



Attendance

How will attendance be taken?

Attendance take each class by using participant list in Schoology and recording presence of student on a roster, then recorded manually in SIS.

- Where will students be able to access course materials if they miss a class? Synchronous lesson visual materials are usually uploaded in Schoology. Teachers will work with the student provide missing materials or direct students to resources that will help with completion of work.
- Will students be expected to make-up synchronous sessions? If a student has missed a live lesson, for the most part they will find materials in the Schoology class page that can be used to supplement missed work. Some work may be waived if the teacher feels the student has adequate skills/knowledge to move on to major work. A synchronous work student buddy may be contacted to talk student through missed or incomplete work.

- We will be using a quarterly gradebook with the categories of graded practice and summative work.
- Students will be given opportunities to complete work until the end of each quarter for summative works.
- We will do everything we can to help students complete all of their work and achieve a level excellence.
- Course letters will be coming home shortly to give more details about grading.

- The art fee is \$25 for semester courses and \$50 for year-long classes.
- It pays for consumable items students will use throughout the class including sketchbook, drawings materials, paints, brushes, etc
- If a student is eligible for free/reduced lunch there is a consent form to be filled out so student art fee can be waived.
- In the coming days you will be getting an invoice from MySchoolBucks seeking that payment.

Class and Assignment Information

• What might a "typical" class look like?

Student may enter the classroom and start with a warm-up and check -in. Next a review of learning targets leads to, mini-lessons that might be a reading review using scholastic art online resources, video demonstration, or short art skill task.

A longer focused studio work session may involve a final reflection. Resources such as teacher made Slideshows with will be used to relay concepts and check for understanding.

We use the online magazine Scholastic Art to promote art, art history and literacy. Schoology is also the site for asynchronous materials. This site will be used to stream information and news about the course, provide clear classwork materials and assignments.

Throughout the year students will work with a variety of materials, techniques, and media to achieve meaningful artmaking in all art courses.
