

7th Grade Curriculum

- Our 7th grade curriculum is a survey of U.S. history from 1865 to the present day. We briefly review material covered in 6th grade and move on to new topics. Throughout the course students will study change that is caused by significant events, society's values, and the contributions of individuals.
- Students will have opportunities to work and effectively communicate their ideas in a number of ways such as reports, presentations, and simulations. We also encourage the sharing of ideas and will have students work as individuals, and in small and large groups, using a variety of sources. Students will complete one performance assessment over the course of the year to demonstrate proficiency of the content.

7th Grade Curriculum - Honors

In addition to the general 7th Grade Curriculum, Honors students will have extended opportunities to practice abstract, critical thinking approaches. Such opportunities include:

- In-depth research and analysis
- Regular current events assignments
- Seminars/discussions
- Other inquiry-based projects to extend and deepen understanding of content

7th AAP Extensions

In addition to the 7th Grade Curriculum, AAP students will be expected to complete:

- Additional Projects, which include DBQ essays, debates, and projects on immigration and the Great Depression
- In-depth research and analysis in any given unit
- Seminars/discussions
- Research and analysis assignments independently

Assessments and Grading Policies

Grading will be in compliance with Luther Jackson and Fairfax County Public Schools' policy. This year Luther Jackson will employ a traditional gradebook. Final grades will be calculated based on an average of the four quarters with trends taken into consideration. In History, we use a Total Points grading system, where each assignment is worth a set number of points. Your course grade will be a combination of both proficiency and practice assignments.

Work Completion Policy:

We expect that all students complete 100% of their work 100% of the time. As a result, all teachers expect students to complete and turn in assignments, even when late.

Missing & Late Work:

Teachers will use comment codes to communicate when work is missing or late. Students have the opportunity to replace the missing code within two weeks with points earned. Work that remains missing after two weeks will receive a 0% score in the gradebook.

Students are given multiple chances to demonstrate mastery of skills and concepts, therefore, no extra credit will be given.
